


Pupil holidays in term time will result in school submitting a fine to LCC for school age children. This is a national policy for all schools.


Reception Classroom





- ▶ Navy school jumper (with or without logo)
- ▶ Navy school cardigan (with or without logo)
- ▶ White polo shirt or shirt
- ▶ Grey school trousers/skirt
- ▶ Grey school dress
- ▶ Blue checked school summer dress
- ▶ Grey school shorts
- ▶ Black shoes or trainers that children can fasten independently e.g. Velcro
- ▶ Long hair must be tied up / no extreme hair styles
- ▶ PE Kit
 - ▶ Coloured t-shirt (Linked to teams used for PE etc - will be confirmed in an email in July 2024 and on home visits)
 - ▶ Black or grey PE shorts
 - or
 - ▶ Black or grey jogging bottoms or leggings
 - ▶ Navy hooded top with logo

What will your child need?

- ▶ A water bottle,
- ▶ Wellington boots,
- ▶ Waterproof coat,
- ▶ A spare change of clothes, including pants and socks,
- ▶ A book bag,
- ▶ They will receive a reading book and record which will need to be in school daily,
- ▶ Homework books will go out on a Thursday and will need to be returned by the following Wednesday,
- ▶ Your child will receive free fruit daily, and
- ▶ All children in Reception will receive free milk. Once your child turns 5 and you would like them to have milk in school, you will have to pay for this (unless they qualify for a free school meal). You will receive more information about this at a later date.

Floppy's Phonics

- ▶ School uses Floppy's phonics to teach early reading.
- ▶ This will be taught in school with linked books being sent home to read and re-read over a week.
- ▶ School has invested in new reading books and continue to work towards making every child a capable and confident reader.
- ▶ Home phonic activities and reading will be huge support to your child's learning in this area.



Meet Dianne, our school cook



- ▶ Mrs Denbigh and her team prepare a range of meals for pupils and cater for all dietary requirements. Please make sure these are clearly recorded on the data collection IN Arbor.
- ▶ Pupils order their choice for their lunch each day. Typically, there are 3 or 4 choices each day - menus can be seen on the school website.

School Dinners

- ▶ Reception and KS1 (Years 1 and 2) dinners are free to all pupils - this is known as a universal free school meal.
- ▶ Your child will get to choose from different options each day. Menus are uploaded onto the [school food details](#) and are updated termly.
- ▶ They are delicious!

Free School Meals

- ▶ Free school meals is a confusing subject. The table below shows the difference between the two types of free school meal.

Universal Free School Meal	Free School Meal
All pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 receive a free school meal known as a Universal Free School Meal	Some pupils will qualify for a free school meal*
From Year 3, pupils would need to pay for a school meal	They will receive a free school meal throughout their time at school
School receives no additional funding	School receives additional funding for each free school meal pupil registered


- ▶ *If you are unsure if your child qualifies for a free school meal, please contact school to discuss this. Details of eligibility will be included in a future email from school.

Extended Schools

- ▶ At Manston, we run a successful breakfast club and after-school club, where pupils are well cared for, provided with a healthy breakfast/snack and play games or complete activities before the start of the school day.
